2018/19 Budget

Budget allocation was £5,660 which comprised

- £4,230 running costs for events
- £900 for student prizes and membership
- £530 special funding request for sponsorship (DVLA coding competition, IWD event)

- £3,498 running costs for events (including sponsorship)
- £600 for student prizes and membership
- £2,000 special funding
