Chair's Report: Context for 2023

- 2021 Renaming from ELITE to The BCS IT Leaders Forum and the 1st BCS IT Leaders
 Conference and 1st Members Symposium all of which was about raising our voice but
 also listening to you. Launched a pilot working group: Pressing Reset on Our IT
 Management Methods
- 2022 Launch of post covid "Refocus and Re-engage" strategy and 6 working groups on topics suggested at the symposium; an attempt at involving more of the membership
- 2022 held 8 events including the annual IT Leaders Conference and Members Symposium
- 2022 Published our first IT Leaders opinion pieces from working group input
- 2022 Reviewed membership lists and revised our regional activity
- 2022 Revised our constitution to be more aligned with member group rules providing for a larger committee and the ability to co-opt members.

Chair's Report: Highlights of 2023

- Launched Re-focus and Re-engage II: "Inform, Involve, and Influence"
- Co-opted two members to the committee so that all working groups had leadership representation on the committee
- As last year, held 8 member events
- Two working groups completed their work and publications are now available
- Numbers requesting to join are high, and healthy competition for places on the committee
