 - Quantum Computing – Is this the Future of IT? – September 2022



Chair's Report: Branch Special Projects

Robotics for schools



- **Aims**

- Making IT Good for Society
- Generate interest among school children in learning about Robotics
- Positioning of Robotics as a STEM topic

- **Method**

- Use of Lego Mindstorm kits as an interactive media to deliver the subject
- Been delivering on this via presentations in school, science fairs, etc.
- Became difficult to work as we dealt with Covid-19
- New approach required

Chair's Report: Branch Special Projects

- How could we deliver online?
- Working party established
 - Developed lesson plan with accompanying videos (2 hrs of Video content in 6 simple lessons) PLUS supporting materials
 - Publicised via STEM to teachers and STEM Ambassadors
 - Trained teachers in the use of the lesson plan and the Lego Mindstorm Kits
 - Delivered to school classes and science fairs online and with a physical presence across Wales.



This event is a basic introduction to robotics and shows robots operating in the real world as well as robot models performing tasks that have been built using a Lego Mindstorm kit. The intention is to provide an understanding of robotics in an entertaining and fun way using a Lego robot.





Chair's Report: Branch Special Projects




- The main area of outreach work undertaken by the South Wales Branch over recent years has been the Lego Robots Project
- This project underlines the BCS aim of making IT good for Society and supports STEM subjects in schools.
- Membership of the group has changed over the years with different members bringing different skills but the leadership has been provided by Paul Bulmer and Jeremy White from the start.
- The group has:
 - Developed a set of Lego Mind Storm robots
 - A number of teaching videos
 - A Key Stage 2 lesson plan
- Demonstrations have been delivered to:
 - Schools
 - Science Fairs
 - BCS Presentations
 - DVLA Code Challenge annual competitions
 - Other educational events

BCS is interested in partnership and contributions, both financial and otherwise, to support the development of the programme.




Grade Distribution
