5. A report from the Chair on the year's activities

The chair thanked everyone for their contribution and their participation in the branch activities over the last year.

Work has been done in collaboration with the BCS central IT team to redevelop and relaunch the website. The chair thanks colleagues for their help and support. Old versions of the branch website have been archived.

An exercise took place during the year to ensure that all BCS branches and special interest groups complied with the ICO data expectations. A report was sent from the NE branch and it was duly reported that the branch complied as all recorded of members were held centrally.

During the year the North West section of the branch (previously the NE branch had included Cumbria) had established a separate and new branch. The chair wished the group every success, and offers have been made to support and help in getting the new branch established. It is hoped that combined events will be considered in the future.

Three of the regions universities have established student chapters and initial discussions are underway to explore how the branch can support and work with the chapters, particularly offering help to promote the BCS to HE and FE students and pupils at school.

The year had seen an increase in the number of events (one per month) and the attendance from members at the events had increased in comparison to the last two years. Overall more than 340 members and non-members attended the events.

8. Any other business – no items have been raised with chair

The BCS 60<sup>TH</sup> Anniversary celebrations were discussed and colleagues noted the plans for centrally organised events to be held throughout the year. It was agreed that the branch would put on a celebratory event towards the end of 2017 as part of the 2017/18 schedule

The re-introduction of student prizes for the best first year student at each of the region's universities was discussed and agreed that this should happen. A prize of £100 per student will be requested (using the new prize request procedures)

Attempts would be made to improve communications via social media – Cris Bloomfield agreed to take on a co-coordinating role for this task

It was noted that MYBCS would replace the current member secure area
