- 1) Membership David advises that the number in the minutes is incorrect, should be 3355. Action Jacqui: correct member numbers before minutes are circulated

ACTION Jacqui/Phil: update attendance register and prune completed / outdated actions before minutes are circulated

Haiyan: YPG has organized 28 events jointly with BCS specialist groups or with external parties over the last year. 13,500 UK members, with 20,000 worldwide. YPG members have to be age 35 or under. A large number of YPG members are students who receive membership as part of the qualification. Dalim: BCS members under 35 are automatically YPG members – something to reflect on for ELITE? Events often run more than once so that people can attend at a convenient time for them. Largest event had 500 attendees. Events are free. It's typical to get a ~50% dropout rate, and the group often overbooks to compensate. YPG website: <a href="http://www.bcs.org/category/9223">http://www.bcs.org/category/9223</a>

16:35 Chair's report – Jacqui

Jacqui - funding for leadership report already noted above.

16:40 Membership Report – David M

As of this week there are 3,358 ELITE members. LinkedIn membership still 1,584 as before.

Owen: difference between EuroCIO engagement with active CIOs versus ELITE's more diverse membership. EuroCIO membership for individuals is a significant cost by comparison with relatively low BCS cost.

Phil notes that ELITE is not the "UK CIO" membership body, as members may not be from the UK, and may not be CIOs or senior IT management of any sort.

Martin: Looked at job roles of LinkedIn group members in Sept 2016. Out of 1484 members:

- 83 CIOs or Chief Information Officers
- 62 that identify as some permutation of IT/ICT Director
- 336 Directors
- 139 Heads
- 46 "Digital" something

Phil: at present new BCS Fellows are not automatically members of ELITE. Should we follow YPG's lead and make new Fellows automatically ELITE members? Haiyan notes that BCS Women membership is opt-in rather than automatic. Owen: are the criteria for Fellowship (seniority, leadership, eminence) compatible with ELITE's requirements? <a href="http://www.bcs.org/category/18249">http://www.bcs.org/category/18249</a>

# ACTION Ian/Dalim/Shakeeb/Chris: develop "straw man" proposal on future ELITE membership criteria for discussion at next meeting

16:45 Treasurer's Report - David T

David: Financial year for BCS including ELITE ends August 31<sup>st</sup>. Expecting to spend entire budget. Major cost items have been EuroCIO membership and European travel spend. Proposed 2017/18 budget will be the same as this year's. Owen notes that his firm is happy to cover his travel costs, so this will not be an expense for BCS.

16:50 EuroCIO Report – Owen

Owen: EuroCIO membership is split between direct members and national bodies like BCS. Focus on deep engagements with major suppliers like Oracle, SAP and Microsoft, and with the European Commission. Lengthy summit discussions about demographics and skills shortfalls, and the impact of Brexit. Proposed to hold a EuroCIO Brexit event in early 2018.

## ACTION Owen/John McCarthy: begin planning for EuroCIO Brexit event

16:55 ELITE rules (potential change on co-option) - Jacqui

Jacqui: ELITE rules state that committee members can be co-opted until the next election. Should we create an exception to the election process for the EuroCIO role given the importance of maintaining a long term relationship with the organisation? Steve: suggests requesting from BCS that EuroCIO role on the committee can be co-opted annually on an ongoing basis, with the other 14 places on the committee elected as normal. The group voted on Steve's proposal and agreed unanimously to take it forward.

### ACTION Steve: write up the EuroCIO committee membership proposal for circulation

17:00 ELITE Secretary Role – Jacqui (and Ian)

The group voted unanimously to co-opt Ian as secretary. He will stand for election in the Autumn.

17:05 AGM and Committee elections for 2017 – Chris + Jacqui

David, Mario and Shakeeb's terms are coming to an end. They need to decide whether they wish to stand again. Chris will start the election process with Mandy at the end of August.

17:15 ELITE Survey – David M + Jacqui

### ACTION Jacqui and David: develop draft survey questions for circulation

Owen: EuroCIO run frequent surveys, but with a very rapid turnaround time, e.g. 48 hours from survey publication. Owen and Phil will liaise to ensure future EuroCIO surveys are communicated quickly to ELITE membership.

Jacqui: Need to make it clear when an event starts versus when registration begins.

ACTION Jacqui/Phil: ensure that event schedules are clear and communicated, and ELITE representative identified to chair

Jacqui: Feedback from event delegates is that events should be more interactive rather than "sage on the stage", unconference approach popular - being trialled at October GDPR event.

ACTION Jacqui: approach GDPR speakers from North London Branch May event to warm up at October event - <a href="http://www.nlondon.bcs.org/pe/pe2017may24.htm">http://www.nlondon.bcs.org/pe/pe2017may24.htm</a> (slides/video)

The group discussed some alternatives to the current ELITE approach to events (e.g. reduced cost or free events, and provision of refreshments) and agreed to make the Nov 9<sup>th</sup> event free as a trial.
