Call for nominations

Early Career/Student Award

The BCS Primary Healthcare Specialist Group wishes to recognise and encourage innovation and excellence in primary care computing and informatics.

The [Early Career/Student Award](#) is awarded to those who have made a contribution to the subject, either as a paper, a piece of software, or a set of accomplishments. All formats will be considered.

For the purposes of this award 'Early Career' is defined as five years or less in primary care IT, while 'Student' is a current student or has graduated within the past two years

As well as a certificate, the prize includes an award of **£250**. The winning entry will be published online via www.phcsg.org and the winner will be supported in submitting their work for publication in [BMJ Health & Care Informatics](#).

The prize winner will be announced at the annual dinner of the [Primary Healthcare Specialist Group conference](#) on the evening of **10th November 2022** at St George Hotel, 1 Ripon Rd, Harrogate, HG1 2SY.

Two of the shortlisted applicants will be asked to attend and present their work at the Education Day meeting that day.

Given the focus on digital in the long term plan, this is an opportunity to encourage innovative use of technology in the service of patients and staff in primary care.
