Call for nominations

John Perry Prize

The [John Perry Prize](#) is the most prestigious award for innovation and excellence in primary care computing or informatics. It is awarded to those individuals or teams who have made an outstanding contribution to the subject, either as a paper, a piece of software, or a set of accomplishments. All formats will be considered.

As well as a certificate, the prize includes an award of **£500**. The winning entry will be published online via www.phcsg.org and the winner will be supported in submitting their work for publication in [BMJ Health & Care Informatics](#).

The award is aimed at those who already have an established career in primary care computing or informatics. Contenders will be expected to have an impact in primary care, either with thought leadership or, most probably, with the development of tools to improve practice efficiency and patient outcomes. Previous winners have developed tools, among others, to support the analysis of appointments, and subsequent changes in ways of working to improve access, which has since been implemented in multiple CCG areas.
