4. Chair's report

Three key points raised in the Chair's report:

- 1. Three roles on the committee are unfilled:
 - a. Early Careers Advocate: UK suggests to co-opt Andy Hind (Oracle) to this role who has indicated willingness in taking this on (Committee agrees to this; **Action UK**: inform BCS to update the group's Web site accordingly), **Action UK**: add AH to IRSG committee mailing list
 - b. Secretary: still unfilled and no volunteer, **Action UK**: find a candidate to fill the position and (once successful) inform the committee via email
 - Also vacant: ICTIR representative now that Frank Hopfgartner is no longer on the committee (Committee agrees to elect IF to be the new IRSG representative on the ICTIR Steering Committee; Action UK + IF: inform BCS and get in touch with the ICTIR Steering Committee)
- 2. The General Chairs (GCs) of ECIR 2024 approached UK to inform the committee of an incident in which an author of a submitted paper was in breach of the ACM's Policy Against Harassment that was adopted by the ECIR 2024 GCs. The committee discussed the case and agreed that there should be a one-year ban for this one author to submit anything to ECIR. Action UK: inform ECIR 2024 and 2025 General Chairs about one-year ban of author in breach of ECIR 2024 harassment policy
- 3. Informer will need to be revived. GD has volunteered to lead the project. **Action UK**: arrange meeting with TRR, GD and UK to get Informer up and running again with a target issue in April 2024. **Action ALL**: contact GD with contributions no later than first week of April

5. Event Organiser's report

The Search Network have asked me to raise this issue of the Search Insights one day event, originally scheduled for February but pushed back tentatively to May. In particular, does the committee still share an interest in holding this event and if so are there any further comments/feedback on the proposal?

From Martin: We agreed that we would lead on structure and content but IRSG needed to set a day, be responsible for working with BCS on the event as needed (eg web site updates) and setting the ticket prices.

Action IF: confirm budget for one-day event support, i.e. whether we can promise support or not (or submit supplementary fund request)

12. ECIR 2024

Author registration and Early Bird deadlines have now passed, and registrations are overall healthy at this stage. Taking into account previous discussions within the community, and to strike a reasonable balance between the authors' costs and financial risks to the conference, for author registrations, we allowed people to register up to 3 papers and only asked authors to pay their relevant registration fee (e.g., students paid student fees). This choice, thus far, worked very well.

We have started allocating student support grants and will continue to support further students as more promised sponsorship money materialises. The Proceedings have been shipped to Springer, and all local arrangements are now in place (incl. contracts).

From this week, all focus will be on delivering a great physical event. We are finalising the schedule and will be communicating to participants and authors shortly. We have abstracts for the keynote presentations and the best paper committee is deliberating the nominations for relevant tracks. In addition, we have a list of PC/SPC members to recognise for an Outstanding Reviewer Award.

The KvR Award received 5 strong nominations. The award panel has met and discussed the nominations. The majority of the nominations would have been worthy winners, but after deliberations the panel selected a winner. The winner has been notified and accepted the award. They will present an additional keynote during the main conference. The introduction of the award was very well received by the community. We received a number of personal messages saying that this type of award (specifically focused on contributions to IR theory) is a great recognition to the recipients and a welcome addition to the current (few) allocated IR awards. The panel also recommended that the award becomes a constant feature of ECIR from now on. We hope that BCS IRSG will get behind and support the KvR award going forward so that it can be a regular component of future ECIRs. We had initially thought that it would be good to have it awarded in the years that the KSJ award was not at ECIR. However, the feedback we received personally and from the award panel was pushing for it to be awarded on a yearly basis, given the large number of possible awardees.
