Prepare a cash flow statement using the **indirect method**, categorising the cash flows under operating, investing, and financing activities.

b) A company makes and sells computers. It has two different models – Office and Office Pro. The company does not have any other form of income.

The company is deciding what prices it will charge for its products. It has information about the overheads for the company.

Discuss **three** ways that the company could allocate overheads so that it ensures they are covered by the income for the products. In your answer, identify information that will be needed to make this allocation.
