- IT Leaders spearhead change

History of the Working Group



- Started work in 2021
- 2022 published BCS Policy brief, Long Finance blogs, joint event with National Preparedness Commission, consulted with over 100 people
- 2023 published BCS report, Long Finance blogs, joint event with Business Continuity Institute, consulted with over 500 people
- 2024 published Service Resilience: reducing the impact of IT failures (London Publishing Partnership), events with SAMI Consulting and Association of Professional Futurists, involving over 100 more people, Long Finance blogs

Work in 2025

- Held 4 RoundTables, involving over 100 more people, including RoundTable leading to Report on Nine Banks data,
- published BCS Policy brief,
- worked with BCS HQ on Education, training and qualifications,
- published 20 short reports with recommendations for ITLF (with others) actions grouped under 4 headings
 - Use of AI to improve availability and service resilience
 - Awareness of resilience status and plans
 - Standards
 - Education, training and qualifications

- Early proposals develop ISO standards for ICT resilience - TC292 Security and Resilience)
