1. Welcome from the Chair

Due to travel delays the chair - Udo Kruschwitz [UK] - could not attend. The treasurer (IF) filled in and welcomed everyone to the meeting.

2. Minutes/Actions of Previous Annual General Meeting

3. Committee Member Reports

3.1. Chair's report

IF presented UK's report on the IRSG activities over the past year:

- Search Solutions 2022 was organised back in person in London after two years of online events. That all worked out really well. Search Solutions 2023 to follow the day after the AGM, i.e. tomorrow (with tutorials today)
- ECIR 2023 was a very successful in-person event in Dublin (as reported in more detail in the group's newsletter Informer and in SIGIR Forum).
- ICTIR was co-located with SIGIR 2023.
- FDIA 2023 was another successful event with IRSG involvement, chaired by Ingo Frommholz, Yashar Moshfeghi and Haiming Liu. This was co-located with ESSIR 2023 in Vienna.
- The CORE management team had reached out to us to indicate that the CORE

- ranking of our flagship conference (ECIR) would need to be re-assessed given the last time this happened was about 5 years or so ago. Sean MacAvaney took the lead in this and prepared a submission. We were very pleased that as a result of this we retained the A ranking (which means the conference is classified as "Excellent")
- The Karen Spärck Jones Award 2022 went to William Yang Wang (University of California, Santa Barbara) who gave a well-received keynote talk at ECIR 2023. It was noted that in future the keynote is planned to alternate between ECIR and the conference of the European Association on Computational Linguistics (EACL) (starting with EACL 2024). An agreement about this had been arranged by Jochen Leidner, the previous panel chair (current chair is Haiming Liu). Microsoft Research was thanked for support of the award over the years. It was reported that the funding agreement has come to an end and Microsoft Research will not be in a position to renew this. We are currently talking to alternative sponsors.
- The winner of the Tony Kent Strix Award 2023 is Martin White (who also served as a co-opted IRSG committee member until he stepped down this year). An online lecture was announced to be held in December.
- This year there are a number categories for Industry Awards to be announced at Search Solutions 2023 (tomorrow)
- The group's Informer newsletter continued to be run under the leadership of Martin White, and the chair thanked him alongside Steve Zimmerman and Tony Russell-Rose who supported Martin. Martin has now stepped down from that role and the January committee meeting will decide on how to continue in the new year.
- The chair was very pleased to announce that ECIR 2025 will be hosted in Lucca.
 General chairs are Franco Maria Nardini, Fabrizio Silvestri and Nicola Tonellotto (Nicola is the co-opted ECIR 2025 representative on the committee).

4. Elections
