Everywoman in Technology Awards 2012 Nomination Questions

- In 100 words, please give a brief overview to the nominee's company/organisation including a description of what it does, no of employees, annual turnover and how long it has been running.
- In 200-300 words, please provide a bio or brief overview of the nominee's career path to date and her role within the current company/organisation (include key responsibilities, how long she has been in the role etc).
- In 250-500 words, please provide details on the following:
 1. Describe why the nominee is a suitable candidate for this specific category
 2. Provide tangible/measurable evidence of the nominee's success (Tip: this could include items such as % increase in sales, % increase in staff retention/performance, increase in efficiencies, new systems introduced that have lead to better performance, personal achievements that have lead to measurable success within the organisation)
 3. Describe how they have impacted the organisation.
- In 200-400 words, please explain why the nominee is a role model to other women aspiring to work in technology.
